The Government recently announced that 2020 had seen the most excess deaths since the Second World War. How do we think of those who are bereaved?

Canon Nigel Cumming offers a shortened version of an imaginary letter written by the Revd. Len Lunn to someone recently bereaved.

My dear Mags,

Thank you so much for your letter. You seem to be surprised that you feel confused and disorientated and not at all yourself. You do, however, seem to be clinging to your real feelings and grieving in the way that you need to-regardless of the expectations of others. Being in some turmoil is normal, this is the biggest loss of your life and changes everything.

Grief is a sign of love

Those who have sent you cards saying things like, 'death is nothing at all' and, 'he is only in the next room' are well-meaning but as you say just very wrong. Peter's death is everything and your pain is probably the greatest that you will ever feel and will never completely leave you. If there is any comfort at this time it may be your insight that your grief is a sign and expression of your love for Peter, which is why you don't want to get over it. Time may bring some healing but who wants to be healed of love?

Try to forgive those friends and neighbours that cross the road or pretend not to have seen you in Tesco's because they don't know what to say. Be a bit selfish; don't worry about protecting yourself even to the point of being a little short with those who go on. Even insensitive folk are normally forgiving of the bereaved. When you feel like it, you now have the perfect excuse to indulge some of your innate eccentricities.

Yes, you are entitled to have those odd moments of fun when you seem to have forgotten that he has gone. Just ignore those who think that you don't cry enough or indeed those who think that you cry too much. Day by day trust your instincts and your own feelings.

IN MEMORIAM

As we approach the anniversary of the first national lockdown, we will be sharing in a service of commemoration for all who have lost their lives during the current pandemic; both those who have died from the direct effects of catching the virus, and those who have died under the constraints of separation from family in care homes or hospitals from other illnesses, including some not diagnosed or treated. Although this is not the end of our story, and a further service will be held when we can gather physically without restriction, this will be an important moment of remembrance.
