## A Word from the Rector

As many of you will now know, we received the sad news recently of the sudden and unexpected death of the Reverend Rob Eardley: a dear friend and welcome neighbour to so many of us across our churches and communities. Rob and Fran moved into Martin three years after I became Rector and he was a godsend; an answer to prayer and a much valued colleague to myself and later also to Nigel in our shared ministry here in Western Downland. Not only was Rob a wise head in so many ways, but he was also generous with his time and wholly dedicated to the life of our congregations and villages, and most especially to the community of Martin. Together with Fran he worked tirelessly and sacrificially for the good of all, and always with the greatest respect, good humour and concern for people's wellbeing. The news of his sudden death was deeply shocking to us, as I know it was even more so to Fran, to his children and grandchildren and to the wider family and his many friends in other parts. I can only say how profoundly grateful I am to have had one final opportunity to share with Rob in leading an act of prayer the Friday before he died. I know that your best wishes and prayers will be with Fran and her family in these difficult days. Of course, they are not the only ones to have suffered loss. There are others dealing with sorrows as our Registers reflect (see From the Registers) and our love and sympathy is extended to all those passing through times of bereavement, as it is with those who are going through periods of ill health, times of transition, or a move to new pastures, all of whom are experiencing different kinds of loss and adjustment. Life is a continuing journey, as God's people knew well. Whilst we may be rooted in ancient communities, in ancient church buildings and in liturgies born of ancient texts, we're all pilgrims of a sort, just passing through; custodians for a time, moving on in life to new and as yet undiscovered country. Through it all God promises that if we look with opened eyes, we will find that presence and peace which is born of God close at hand. Though Joseph and Mary suffered much anguish in the journey they made to Bethlehem, it was a journey ultimately made toward hope and joy, towards life born of God bursting from the womb; life generously offered on a cross and bursting once more with life for all out of a borrowed tomb. In a world where so many suffer pain through conflict, hunger and disease, it's an encouragement to know that God works to bless us, not to harm; to heal us and love us into eternity. It was this sure hope which inspired Rob in his extraordinary life, as it has been the hope of so many whose stories are written into the fabric of these communities, so many who have journeyed on from this life to the next. May he and they rest in peace and rise in glory. And on your own continuing journey wherever it is ultimately leading may you encounter a profoundly moving Christmas and a peaceful and hope-filled New Year. Rev'd Les Player
