A Word from the Rector

Most of us are shaped by what we see with our eyes. Knowing this, advertising agencies are expert at dressing, editing and lighting products in such a way that they look desirable to the eye. They can also look very different to the product you end up with. Jesus wanted people to look beyond what was apparent to the naked eye. For example, to see beyond the ugliness of the Cross, or the differences that caused people to discount others. There's a vast amount we can't see with the naked eye; things which are nonetheless vital to our thriving, from the air we breathe to the bonds of identity we share. There's much that we do not and may never understand but which we rely on. I'm fascinated by the technology which can map out the root system of a tree, and even how it functions and telescopes which reveal a density of stars invisible to the unaided eye. Many things appear unchanging and rigid, but are in reality - dynamic and delicate, sensitive to even small variations. The film 'Avatar' enlarges on this theme. In it tree root connects to tree root, and life form to life form so that everything is interdependent, and damage done to one wounds all. There's a sense in which we're all interconnected. We can see that the removal of a species, or its introduction, can radically alter an ecosystem and the removal of a tree from a canopy makes other trees vulnerable. Of course, the removal of a tree from a canopy also lets in light and space to encourage new life which is otherwise choked out. It's a complex picture. Much of our own culture has been founded on a Christian narrative which has long since been set aside by many of us or is not our inherited story. Yet its impact continues to shape our lives, our healthcare and education systems, forms of justice and agencies for charity, concepts of human dignity and collective accountabilities. Apparently rigid and unchanging, I would argue that the Church is in fact dynamic and vitally alive, and that it has largely been a force for good (with some very visible and hugely painful exceptions). The Church has grown to provide a common framework to celebrate our personal and collective joys, to mark our achievements and to comfort our sorrows; to treasure, challenge, interpret and retell our local and global stories and to effect profound change in our society. Today our churches continue to engage, nourish, support, safeguard, comfort. Much of this is unseen by most of us. And it's coming under pressure as fewer people play their part. Perhaps there's a case for saying that some things should die in order that new things flourish. But as fewer people participate the system we rely on - that we assume will always be there - is under threat. Although they give generously of time and talent, our small congregations of regular attenders are more limited by age and health circumstances. What unforeseen impacts might the absence of these congregations have on our wider community life? Would it expose other parts of our communities to increased pressure and leave some, perhaps many, more vulnerable? Will we wake up one day to discover a collective loss because we failed to play our part to help sustain living churches, with unforeseen ramifications for us all? I'll write more about this later in the year, but for now - whilst thanking the many of you who already play apart - I simply ask whether YOU are willing to invest time and talent to ensure a thriving, continuing Church presence in our communities for the long-term?
