A Word from the Rector

As I write this I've been going full pelt in my professional duties for many weeks. So I can appreciate the appeal of the late summer and early autumn, when Schools are generally on holiday and many of us take a break from our more usual activities and groups to do something a different; to pause and relax. It's good to have some space, to rest and be refreshed.

Sadly, not everyone has the luxury of this. In many parts of our world urgent demands, conflict and disaster mean the absence of peace. And many people's circumstances, including many in our own nation means that there are large sections of society where people get little rest, or cannot afford a break. At times Jesus was almost overwhelmed by the demands laid upon him, and certainly at times he was weary. Yet he offered something extraordinary to those around him, the ability to find rest: 'Come to me all who are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.' (St Matthew's Gospel, chapter 11). This rest appears to be rooted in Jesus himself, and speaks not so much to our outer circumstances as our inner wellbeing. Jesus touches a chord in people's longing; he promises to be an anchor point; a still place of calm in the storm, a never-failing well of refreshment.

Wellbeing is a buzz word these days, but though many books, groups and organisations promote it, it seems elusive. Indeed, in quite a lot of cases those who applaud wellbeing act in such ways that they undermine its reality. What Jesus offers appears to be of a different order of magnitude. He finds himself in the midst of the storm on the Sea of Galilee and in the midst of the storm in his arrest and trial. He is pursued by the crowds and attacked by his opponents; he is hunted, ridiculed, crucified. Yet he seems to be the calm point in the storm; not untouched by what s going on around him, but equally not undone by it. He meets hatred with love, hurt with forgiveness, division with hospitality, the wounds in others with healing, arrogance in others with servanthood, despair in others with grace and acceptance: 'Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. I do not give as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.' (John's Gospel chapter 14).

The peace Jesus offers then and now emanates from deep within his identity, and from his relationship with his heavenly Father, a relationship he offers freely to us all; an open invitation, saying: 'Come to me and I will give you rest.

THE INTERNET COMES TO LOCAL CHURCHES

We are installing fibre broadband to the churches in the benefice. This will have considerable advantages for providing the Sunday streams from the church service that week, the ability for church fundraising events (such as Snowdrop Sunday) to offer card payments and allowing electronic donations to churchgoers in addition to the usual collection plate. Since COVID, contactless payments with a credit/debit card has taken over for convenience and accountability.

All Saints Church already has a donation kiosk at the back of the church for electronic donations, and Damerham will shortly install their kiosk as well.
