A Word from the Rector

Lost. That must have been the experience of Joseph and Mary as they arrived in a Bethlehem packed to the gills with people required to register in their home town as part of a 'global' Imperial census (most likely for Roman taxation purposes) ordered by the Emperor Augustus. That lost feeling must have been born for Mary in her betrothal to a man she barely knew, and in the angelic visitation which declared her pregnancy. It must have been heightened for them both by their arduous journey south from Nazareth. And when the best in terms of accommodation that Joseph could come up with for the heavily pregnant Mary was a bare corner of an innkeeper's cattle shed, that lost feeling must have seemed chasm-deep. But perhaps they felt most lost during Mary's agonising labour - and after the labour was over, when they both held a fragile infant life; their firstborn, in their arms. Though probably the feeling of being all at sea continued with the extraordinary declarations of the shepherds, the arrival of foreign soothsayers bearing gifts and the sudden flight into Egypt just ahead of the assassin swords despatched by Herod.

All in all, Joseph and Mary would have had every reason to feel abandoned, and utterly alone. I would imagine questions and doubts repeatedly spun around their heads, along with desperate plans for stepping off the merry-go-round (like Joseph's plan to privately break off the engagement to Mary when he discovered she was pregnant). But for the reader of the Nativity narratives, though it might have appeared that everything was chaotic and haphazard, the reality was far from meaningless and without purpose. The Nativity is the story of an unbroken and unbreakable thread, woven through the past and on into the present; a golden thread which creates a future quite beyond imagination; one of eternal hope and divine blessing. We may feel lost in our own confusing circumstances or tossed about by the vagaries of a world passing through tumultuous times, but the Christmas story is a message of eternal hope and sure purpose; a reminder that God will never turn a blind eye to our personal struggles, or his back on our collective heartache. God is always present. And always ready to transcend what we think is possible, to transform what we feel to be hopeless. That is God's Christmas gift, wrapped not in tinsel and fairy lights, but in the human form of a vulnerable baby who ultimately goes to hell and back for us, and never once throws in the towel.
