For many churches the months of September and October are times to celebrate the harvest, to focus on environmental issues, to reflect on God's creativity. The theme of this season of creation for 2023 is "Let Justice and Peace flow like a river". The dangers associated with climate change have been talked about for decades, but few people appreciated the speed of the change. Most people realise that now, in 2023, there is a pressing need for concerted action amongst all nations to keep global temperatures at a level that will enable this planet to survive; at least as human beings might recognise it. Underlying all this is the need for fairness, or justice for everyone on the planet.

It is well known that the more prosperous, industrialised nations have been the major sources of the toxic emissions into the atmosphere, yet many financially poorer countries are bearing the full brunt of climate change catastrophes. It is so easy to point fingers at other countries that "pollute more than us", and use this as an argument not to do anything too radical. In the meantime, some parts of the world are suffering and do not have the means to do much to rectify the situation. The planet is crying out for co-operation, for global leadership, for common sense, for justice for all. There are no easy answers whilst countries are locked in territorial wars and disputes, or internal power struggles. Energy badly needed for co-operation seems so pointlessly wasted. One might wonder what Jesus might say today to leaders of the world - but would they, would we be listening? "Let Justice roll on like a river," said the prophet Amos; "Love your neighbour as you love yourself," quoted Jesus. Who are we listening to in 2023?

In the UK church calendar, this Autumn we again give thanks for the harvest, to celebrate humanity working in harmony with the Creator. Once again, we will have thanked God for the rhythm of the seasons, as well as for the work of people who produce our food. May our thanksgivings this year include all those who are willing to share their bounty with others who have less: it could be with the local food banks; or sharing with refugees; or it might be encouraging our own leaders to be more generous, more gracious, with people who are suffering directly because of climate change. Every little helps.

It's a matter of justice. It matters to God - who loves us all.
